

Repetition and exam project

A slight bit of repetition and then time to work on the presentation video for your exam project

Position

- Use a tripod to stabilize the shot
- If panning or tilting be sure you can film all of it well
- If you do not use a tripod make sure that you yourself are stabilized as well as possible

Frame

- Think of the framing, horizontal and vertical lines
- Check the white balance of the camera (if possible)
- Make sure the subject/area is in focus
- Make sure the background is proper

Audio

- Make sure the sound-recording equipment is setup properly
- Try to control background noise if possible
- Think of speak from the subject

Keep in mind

- Be polite to people around you
 - Especially when shooting in public areas
 - Many people do not like being filmed
- Use date/time stamp sparingly
- Be prepared to retake a shot - many times

Record


- Make sure you **are** recording
- Make sure no wrong things come in front of the lens
- Look at the status-display
- Use both eyes
 - One on the view-finder, one scans the surroundings
- Practice walking backwards

Basics

- Know your source material
 - Know it well
- If using music you will end up knowing the song so well you will hate it - at least a little


Starting Premiere

- Click "New project"




Starting Premiere

- Choose where to save project, leave rest as standard for now




- Either click on “Import media to start” or drag files into the media library


- Double-click on video to get options
- Press I to set fade-in and O to set fade-out
- Right-click on video on time-line and choose unlink to unlink sound and video


- Sequend->Sequence setting to change size and other aspects of final video
- Double-click on clip to be able to stretch it


- Right-click video, Speed-duration to change speed


- Expand so you can see the add/remove key-frame button

- File -> Export -> Media -> H.264 is usually fine for modern uses but you can chose among a myriad of options and qualities

Startin



- Go to the Effects pane in the content overview -> Keying -> Ultra Key
- Go to Effects in the source control Window -> Chose a colour to remove
- Change setting to set how much of the adjacent colours to remove
